(Q) Who is eligible to enroll in a Success Center class?

(A) Students residing in the Tulsa Tech School District who are currently in 9th-12th grade seeking credit recovery or first time credit, or 8th grade students wanting first time high school credit the summer before their 9th grade year. Also, any adult needing credit recovery or first time credit in order to obtain their high school diploma who can verify the credit will be accepted by the educational institution

(Q) What services are available through the Success Centers and who benefits from Success Center services?

(A) Success Centers provide educational opportunities for students seeking to recover high school credit or earn first-time credits. Services are available to any current high school student or adult.

(Q) Where are Success Centers located?

(Q) What are the days and hours of operation for the Success Centers?

September - May

4 - 8 pm, Monday - Thursday

June & July

12 - 4 pm, Monday - Thursday

Success Centers will be closed for all school holidays

(Q) How much does it cost to take a course at the Success Center?

(A) Each semester course costs \$45 and includes all necessary supplies. Once tuition is paid, no refunds will be possible.

(Q) Where do I get a Success Center enrollment form?

(A) You can pick up a Success Center enrollment form from your high school counselor, at any Tulsa Tech campus location, or by visiting tulsa.tech.edu/resources-for/prospective-students/success-centers. All forms must be signed by the appropriate high school counselor.

(Q) Can students enroll in more than one (1) course at a time?

(A) No, students will only be enrolled in one semester course at a time when multiple courses are requested.

(Q) What do I do after my Success Center enrollment form has been completed?

(A) A parent/guardian and student should bring the enrollment form to the Success Center site the student plans to attend. The Success Center counselor will review the form to verify all information is correct and clear. Once the enrollment form is complete, the counselor will direct the student to the office where payment can be accepted.

(Q) What system do the Success Centers use to offer high school coursework?

(A) Edgenuity is a comprehensive, online instructional system that is accredited and accepted by the Oklahoma State Department of Education. Edgenuity has been customized to the needs of our students to offer a wide range of high school coursework.

(Q) Who provides on-site assistance at each of the Success Center locations?

(A) Each of the Success Center locations is staffed with two certified instructors, one for English/Social Studies and one for Mathematics/Science, as well as a Master's level certified counselor. Faculty and staff are facilitators that provide individual assistance for students.

(Q) What are the attendance requirements for the Success Center?

(A) Students are required to spend a minimum of four (4) hours per week on-site. The required on-site hours can be broken up throughout the week to accommodate student schedules. Students are also expected to stay on track with their coursework. Students and parents will be asked to sign a form accepting policies.

(Q) What is the time limit to complete a course?

(A) The length of time to complete a course is determined through discussion with a Success Center counselor and based on the individual student's needs.

(Q) Where can students work on their Success Center course?

(A) Students can login to complete their coursework from any computer with internet access. Students are encouraged to work from home, but will be required to take exams and tests at a Success Center location. Internet access is necessary if working at home.

(Q) Who is responsible for sending Success Center grades to the high school?

(A) The Tulsa Tech registrar will send Success Center grades to the appropriate high school for transcription.

(Q) Is transportation provided to and from the Success Centers?

(A) Transportation is the student/parents/guardians' responsibility.

(Q) Is security provided during the Success Center's hours of operation?

(A) Security is available at all Tulsa Tech campuses.
