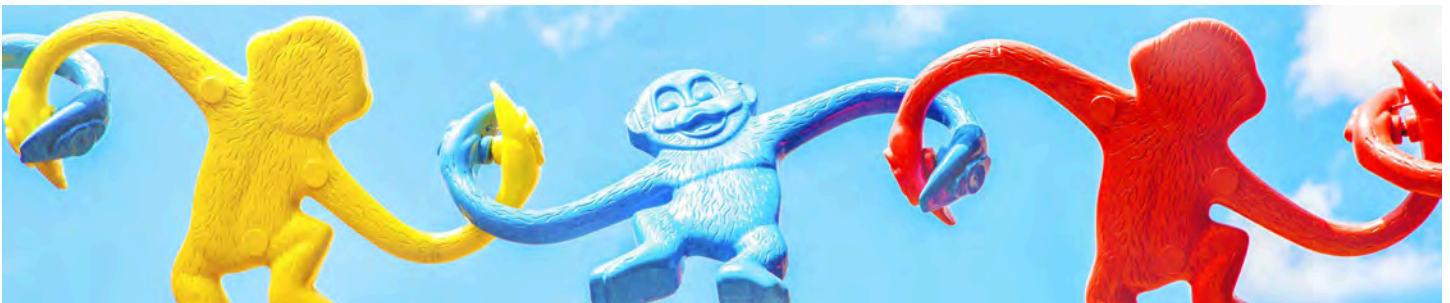

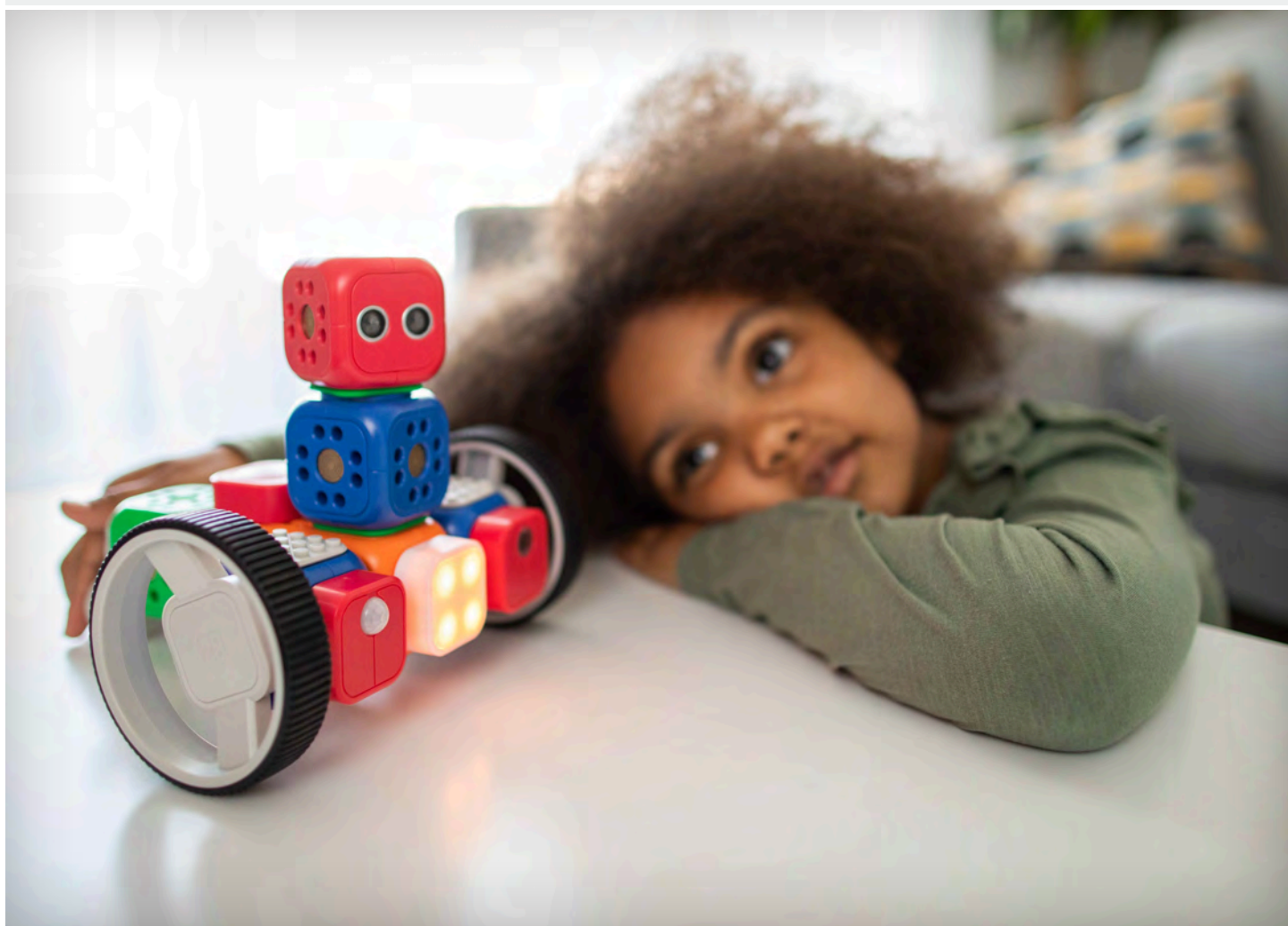

### Families of Children with Special Needs (All Ages) (ECE-3469)

Share information and connect with the families of children with special needs.

### Inclusion of Children with Special Needs (All Ages) (ECE-3968)

Become familiar with effective strategies for including children with special needs in the childcare setting. Learn how to adapt curriculum activities, materials, and equipment.

### Children-Oppositional Defiant Disorder (All Ages) (ECE-4030)

Young children are often seen as “defiant” when they are tired, hungry, or upset. But there are a growing number of children who exhibit defiant behaviors at other times and more frequently. You will learn the symptoms, causes, and classroom strategies for helping young children with Oppositional Defiant Disorder.
